United Church of Christ Disabilities Ministries

is on a mission to make UCC churches Accessible to All (A2A) The first step in this process was completing a church building and program accessibility audit. The audit is designed to examine the attitudes and physical structures of our church for accessibility by people with physical, mental, and developmental disabilities. The purpose is to make our faith community welcoming and inclusive of everyone into all aspects of the life of the church. The audit is a guide which helps to determine what work has already been done and what areas need to be improved. It was not an all-inclusive list and some items do not apply to our setting. This topic was brought to consistory and Amanda Custer has volunteered to head up the process along with the property committee. There are goals to be completed within the next year, 3 years, and 5 years. Berlin Fife & Drum Corps

The following are just a few highlights taken from Jim Darr's "The History of the Berlin Fife and Drum Corps" as published in the BAHS Summer 2004 memos.

George Johnson was the originator of fifing and drumming in Berlin. On April 7, 1777, at the age of 17, Johnson ran away from home and enlisted in the Revolutionary Army of Shepardstown, Virginia. He served as a fifer for three years under Capt. Iserlow and Colonels Nevill and Berford with the Virginia troops.

Through George Johnson, Berlin has had fifers and drummers since 1782, the Fife and Drum Corps consisting of military veteran musicians and local recruits.

In the year 1887 a camp of the Sons of Union Veterans was organized at Berlin and uniformed members took in the Fife and Drum Corps and became well organized and trained in a military manner.

During the presidential campaign of William B. McKinley, in 1896, the Corps accompanied a seven passenger coach train from Somerset County to Cancon, Ohio, and paraded from the station to the residence of Mr. McKinley. President McKinley himself had ties with the Frosty Sons of Thunder, often setting up his summer White House in the cooler climate of Somerset County.

From the very first observance of Memorial Day in Berlin, a Fife and Drum Corps of the town participated annually in the parade.

In 1976, the year of America's Bicentennial, the Corps marched in Philadelphia in the Pennsylvania Parade.

A great deal of the history of the Berlin Fife and Drum Corps during the twentieth Century revolves around the central figure of Ralph G. Landis. Perhaps no man other than our founder, George Johnson, has been so instrumental in keeping alive the spirit of the great fife and drum tradition in the hills around Berlin.

Membership in the Berlin Fife and Drum Corps is a long tradition in the Berlin area. Several members served for over forty years, C. William Altfather, James "Fremont" Stuck, Alfred Queer, Chuck Robb and Rollie Fogle just to name a few.

With the devastating events of September 11, 2001, the corps was called upon to perform services at the Flight 93 crash site, also at the Flight 93 Memorial Church, next to Shanksville, PA. The next summer the Corps was honored to have led the "Living Flag" through the streets of Shanksville, in the largest 4th of July parade in the history of the town.

It is our hope that our long tradition of fifing and drumming in the Allegheny Mountains will encourage succeeding generations of Frosty Sons of Thunder to join the Corps and enjoy the thrill of keeping alive a centuries old musical heritage. Indeed, it is our hope that one hundred years from now, parade spectators will still raise the cry "Here comes Berlin!"

Knotty Knotters

The Knotty Knotters is a ministry of the Holy Trinity Lutheran Church, Berlin, PA. They make covers, prayer shawls, Izzy dolls, dish cloths, walker catties, chemo hats and baby hats. In 2022 they made and gave away 333 items. Not including the Veteran's covers. For the covers they meet in the Lutheran church basement on Tuesday mornings from 9:00 am. To 12:00 p.m. to put the covers together and knot them. They do 3 to 6 covers every week. Once they are knotted, they are bound by someone in their home. The other items they do are made in people's homes. They have supplied items to the following: Allegheny Co Children & Youth, Penn Hills, Pittsburgh, PA; Perry Co Children and Youth Services, New Bloomfield, Pittsburgh, PA: Cumberland Co Children and Women's Center, Pittsburgh, PA; N.A.L.E. Disaster Relief, Birthright, Somerset PA; Meyersdale Manor, Meyersdale PA; Johnstown Hospice, Johnstown PA; John Murtha Cancer Center, Johnstown, PA; Twin Lakes, Somerset PA; Bruce Outreach Ministries, Westernport, MD; Ruby Family House, Morgantown, WV; Windber Breast Cancer Center, Windber PA; Somerset Oncology, Somerset PA; Drug babies in Johnstown, Johnstown PA and members of the community in need of a cover or any other item that they make. The Knotty Knotters members are from the community and beyond. The items are made especially for you with love and prayers by "The Knotty Knotters".


