Scripture - Joshua 3:7-17

- **7** And the Lord said to Joshua, "This day I will begin to exalt you in the sight of all Israel, that they may know that, as I was with Moses, so I will be with you.
- **8** And you shall command the priests who bear the ark of the covenant, 'When you come to the brink of the waters of the Jordan, you shall stand still in the Jordan.'
- **9** And Joshua said to the people of Israel, "Come hither, and hear the words of the Lord your God."
- **10** And Joshua said, "Hereby you shall know that the living God is among you, and that he will without fail drive out from before you the Canaanites, the Hittites, the Hivites, the Perizzites, the Girgashites, the Amorites, and the Jebusites.
- **11** Behold, the ark of the covenant of the Lord of all the earth is to pass over before you into the Jordan.
- **12** Now therefore take twelve men from the tribes of Israel, from each tribe a man.
- **13** And when the soles of the feet of the priests who bear the ark of the Lord, the Lord of all the earth, shall rest in the waters of the Jordan, the waters of the Jordan shall be stopped from flowing, and the waters coming down from above shall stand in one heap."
- **14** So, when the people set out from their tents, to pass over the Jordan with the priests bearing the ark of the covenant before the people,
- 15 and when those who bore the ark had come to the Jordan, and the feet of the priests bearing the ark were dipped in the brink of the water (the Jordan overflows all its banks throughout the time of harvest),
- **16** the waters coming down from above stood and rose up in a heap far off, at Adam, the city that is beside Zarethan, and those flowing

down toward the sea of the Arabah, the Salt Sea, were wholly cut off; and the people passed over opposite Jericho.

17 And while all Israel were passing over on dry ground, the priests who bore the ark of the covenant of the Lord stood on dry ground in the midst of the Jordan, until all the nation finished passing over the Jordan.

By eating this bread and drinking this cup, we proclaim Christ's death, celebrate Christ's resurrection, and await Christ's coming again.

United Church of Christ Disabilities Ministries

is on a mission to make UCC churches Accessible to All (A2A) The first step in this process was completing a church building and program accessibility audit. The audit is designed to examine the attitudes and physical structures of our church for accessibility by people with physical, mental, and developmental disabilities. The purpose is to make our faith community welcoming and inclusive of everyone into all aspects of the life of the church. The audit is a guide which helps to determine what work has already been done and what areas need to be improved. It was not an all-inclusive list and some items do not apply to our setting. This topic was brought to consistory and Amanda Custer has volunteered to head up the process along with the property committee. There are goals to be completed within the next year, 3 years, and 5 years. In future newsletters and bulletins, you may be seeing educational materials regarding different disability categories and how we are addressing these in our church and our community as part of this process. If you have any specific questions, please see Amanda Custer.

A Moment of Thankfulness from Keyston Family Alliance Thank you for partnering with Keystone Family Alliance through your giving! Your partnership is making a huge difference. I wanted to give you a brief update on the impact of your investment. This past week alone social workers posted 20 needs in 7 different counties on Gateway. Daily we hear how volunteers around the state are meeting the tangible needs of foster, adoptive, biological, and kinship families through Gateway. As those tangible needs are being met, relationships are being formed. Those relationships are leading to impact well beyond just meeting the tangible needs. As of this writing there are 1,860 volunteers registered through Gateway to meet local needs. That number is growing daily. The goal is to have at least 550 people registered in all 67 counties so that one day more than 35,000 volunteers are willing to consider meeting tangible needs in their communities.

More than 400 people have stepped up to serve on Care Communities around the state. Foster families who have a care community are fostering longer and stronger.

Through KFA events this past year, more than 30 individuals or couples have started the process to become foster parents. This is great news for Pennsylvania's children who are waiting for good foster or adoptive homes.


In 2023, Keystone Family Alliance officially launched in 5 new counties, in Lebanon, York, Armstrong, Northumberland, and Clearfield. That totals to 16 County Coordinators in 16 counties around the state. We anticipate adding at least one more county before the end of the year and several more over the next six months. God has brought together an incredible team that is making a difference.

And thanks to people like you, God continues to blow our minds by meeting the KFA financial needs. In 2020 we were only in Centre County with an annual budget of \$35,000. In 2021 the budget increased to \$127,000 as we began to expand statewide. It grew to \$245,000 in 2022 and by 2023 it increased to \$565,000. God has been so faithful to meet the growing need and we trust He will continue to resource what He has called us to accomplish. Each year as we dream God-sized dreams, we look at the new financial need and realize the only way the mission can be accomplished is with God's favor.
