Return to the Lord, your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love, and repents of evil. 14 Who knows whether he will not turn and repent. and leave a blessing behind him, a cereal offering and a drink offering for the Lord, your God? **15** Blow the trumpet in Zion: sanctify a fast; call a solemn assembly: 16 gather the people. Sanctify the congregation; assemble the elders; gather the children, even nursing infants. Let the bridegroom leave his room, and the bride her chamber. 17 Between the vestibule and the altar let the priests, the ministers of the Lord, weep and say, "Spare thy people, O Lord, and make not thy heritage a reproach, a byword among the nations. Why should they say among the peoples, 'Where is their God?' " 18 Then the Lord became jealous for his land, and had pity on his people.

# Matthew 6: 1-6, 16-18

**1** "Beware of practicing your piety before men in order to be seen by them; for then you will have no reward from your Father who is in heaven.

**2** "Thus, when you give alms, sound no trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, that they may be praised by men. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward.

**3** But when you give alms, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing,

**4** so that your alms may be in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

**5** "And when you pray, you must not be like the hypocrites; for they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners, that they may be seen by men. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward.

**6** But when you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

**16** "And when you fast, do not look dismal, like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces that their fasting may be seen by men. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward.

17 But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face,18 that your fasting may not be seen by men but by your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you.
