Old Testament Scripture Lesson from Sirach Chapter 10, vs 12-18

- ¹² The beginning of human pride is to forsake the Lord; the heart has withdrawn from its Maker.
- ¹³ For the beginning of pride is sin, and the one who clings to it pours out abominations. Therefore the Lord brought upon them unheard-of calamities and destroyed them completely.^[e]
- ¹⁴ The Lord overthrew the thrones of rulers and enthroned the lowly in their place.
- ¹⁵ The Lord plucked up the roots of the nations^[] and planted the humble in their place.
- ¹⁶ The Lord laid waste the lands of the nations and destroyed them to the foundations of the earth.
- ¹⁷ He removed some of them and destroyed them and erased the memory of them from the earth.
- ¹⁸ Pride was not created for human beings or violent anger for those born of women.

Epistle Lesson from the Book of Hebrews, Chapter 13 VS 1-8

- **1** Let brotherly love continue.
- **2** Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for thereby some have entertained angels unawares.
- **3** Remember those who are in prison, as though in prison with them; and those who are ill-treated, since you also are in the body.
- **4** Let marriage be held in honor among all, and let the marriage bed be undefiled; for God will judge the immoral and adulterous.
- **5** Keep your life free from love of money, and be content with what you have; for he has said, "I will never fail you nor forsake you."
- 6 Hence we can confidently say,

"The Lord is my helper,

I will not be afraid:

what can man do to me?"

7 Remember your leaders, those who spoke to you the word of God; consider the outcome of their life, and imitate their faith.

The Gospel of Jesus Christ from the Book of Luke, Chapter 14 vs 7-14

- **7** Now he told a parable to those who were invited, when he marked how they chose the places of honor, saying to them,
- **8** "When you are invited by any one to a marriage feast, do not sit down in a place of honor, lest a more eminent man than you be invited by him;
- **9** and he who invited you both will come and say to you, 'Give place to this man,' and then you will begin with shame to take the lowest place.
- **10** But when you are invited, go and sit in the lowest place, so that when your host comes he may say to you, 'Friend, go up higher'; then you will be honored in the presence of all who sit at table with you.
- **11** For every one who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted."
- **12** He said also to the man who had invited him, "When you give a dinner or a banquet, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your kinsmen or rich neighbors, lest they also invite you in return, and you be repaid.

- **13** But when you give a feast, invite the poor, the maimed, the lame, the blind,
- **14** and you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you. You will be repaid at the resurrection of the just."

Beginning September 14th, Sue Coughenour will begin a new indepth study of the book of Daniel. Using Dr. Alan B. Stringfellow's method of studying Daniel, we will bring clarity and understanding to one of the most misunderstood books in Scripture. By embarking on this journey, believers will discover the influence that the book of Daniel had on the life and literature of the Jewish people throughout the biblical period and all the way to the writers of the New Testament, including Jesus Christ Himself, who often quoted from it. But nowhere is that influence seen as thoroughly as in the writings of the apostle John and parallels that exist with the book of Revelation. As in John's prophetic work, the book of Daniel describes in beautiful and marvelous language the glorious coming of our Lord, Jesus Christ. Like John, Daniel was sure and certain about the final triumph of the kingdom of God. Everyone is invited to join us in the Fellowship Hall following the morning worship service. Come give Sunday School a try - we are

never too old, nor can we say we know enough about scripture to say it isn't for you.

In preparation of this class, please read the book of Daniel (only 12 chapters), and bring your Bible, pen and notebook to our first class. I think this will be one of our best studies yet!
