Hebrew Scripture - Genesis 32: 22-31

- The same night he arose and took his two wives, his two maids, and his eleven children, and crossed the ford of the Jabbok.
- He took them and sent them across the stream, and likewise everything that he had.
- **24** And Jacob was left alone; and a man wrestled with him until the breaking of the day.
- **25** When the man saw that he did not prevail against Jacob, he touched the hollow of his thigh; and Jacob's thigh was put out of joint as he wrestled with him.
- Then he said, "Let me go, for the day is breaking." But Jacob said, "I will not let you go, unless you bless me."
- And he said to him, "What is your name?" And he said, "Jacob."
- **28** Then he said, "Your name shall no more be called Jacob, but Israel, for you have striven with God and with men, and have prevailed."
- Then Jacob asked him, "Tell me, I pray, your name." But he said, "Why is it that you ask my name?" And there he blessed him.
- So Jacob called the name of the place Peniel, saying, "For I have seen God face to face, and yet my life is preserved."
- The sun rose upon him as he passed Penuel, limping because of his thigh.

Epistle – Romans 9: 1-5

- 1 I am speaking the truth in Christ, I am not lying; my conscience bears me witness in the Holy Spirit,
- 2 that I have great sorrow and unceasing anguish in my heart.
- For I could wish that I myself were accursed and cut off from Christ for the sake of my brethren, my kinsmen by race.
- They are Israelites, and to them belong the sonship, the glory, the covenants, the giving of the law, the worship, and the promises;
- to them belong the patriarchs, and of their race, according to the flesh, is the Christ. God who is over all be blessed for ever. Amen.

Gospel - Matthew 14: 13-21

- **13** Now when Jesus heard this, he withdrew from there in a boat to a lonely place apart. But when the crowds heard it, they followed him on foot from the towns.
- **14** As he went ashore he saw a great throng; and he had compassion on them, and healed their sick.
- **15** When it was evening, the disciples came to him and said, "This is a lonely place, and the day is now over; send the crowds away to go into the villages and buy food for themselves."
- **16** Jesus said, "They need not go away; you give them something to eat."
- **17** They said to him, "We have only five loaves here and two fish."
- 18 And he said, "Bring them here to me."
- **19** Then he ordered the crowds to sit down on the grass; and taking the five loaves and the two fish he looked up to heaven, and blessed, and broke and gave the loaves to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the crowds.
- **20** And they all ate and were satisfied. And they took up twelve baskets full of the broken pieces left over.
- **21** And those who ate were about five thousand men, besides women and children.

We praise you for Christ's birth, life, death, and resurrection, and for the calling forth of your church for its mission in the world. Gifted by the presence of your Holy Spirit, we offer ourselves to you as we unite our voices with the entire family of your faithful people everywhere:





Merciful God, as sisters and brothers in faith, we recall anew these words and acts of Jesus Christ. Now as they were eating, Jesus took bread, and blessed, and broke it, and gave it to the disciples and said: "Take eat: This is my body."

Jesus took a cup, and after giving thanks, gave it to the disciples and said: "Drink of it, all of you; for this is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins."

We remember Christ's promise not to drink of the fruit of the vine again until the heavenly banquet at the close of history, and we say boldly what we believe:

Christ had died, Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Come, Holy Spirit, come. Bless this bread and bless this fruit of the vine. Bless all of us in our eating and drinking at this table that our eyes may be opened, and we may recognize the risen Christ in our midst, in each other, and in all for whom Christ died. **Amen.**

Breaking Bread and Pouring Wine:

Through the broken bread we participate in the body of Christ. Through the cup of blessing we participate in the new life Christ gives.

Resurrection Acclamation:

Alleluia! Christ our Passover is offered for us. Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia!
