Morning Prayer and Sermon

Welcome to Trinity Church!

You may have seen on the front cover that it reads *Septuagesima Sunday*. What does this mean? In the Evangelical & Reformed tradition and from the Altar Book it notes that the three Sundays before Lent are to be treated as Sundays in preparation for Lent. The Sundays are called *Septuagesima*, *Sexagesima*, and *Quinquagesima*.

Septuagesima Sunday is the name for the ninth Sunday before East, the third before Ash Wednesday. The term comes from the Latin word “seventieth.” The significance of this naming is as follows: “Septuagesima Sunday is so called because it falls within seventy days but more than sixty days before Easter. Because every Sunday recalls the resurrection of Christ, they are considered “little Easters” and not treated as days of penance.” [Andrew Hughes]

The 17-day period beginning on Septuagesima Sunday was intended to be observed as a preparation for the season of Lent, which is itself a period of spiritual preparation. In many countries, however, Septuagesima Sunday marked and still marks the traditional start of the carnival season, culminating on Shrove Tuesday, sometimes known as Mardi Gras.

You may notice that the parament color has turned purple this year as the tradition also includes the use of purple vestments. The purple signifies penitence, preparation, mourning, humiliation and the passion.

This year, we will return to that “historical liturgical practice” that fell out of practice 50 years ago or more. The opportunity to seek the “holiness of God” so that we may behold the “glory of God.” The scripture lessons will have a decidedly challenging focus of leading us to consider our spiritual roots.

Welcome to “pre-Lent” this year. Come to the well of salvation and drink deeply of our Lord Jesus Christ.
