Today is a day of beginnings and endings.

We celebrate with joy and thanksgiving the confirmation of 8 daughters and sons of Trinity Church as they stand before the congregation affirming the promises made for them at their baptism and confessing their faith in Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior.

We welcome Bishop Paula Schmitt of the Allegheny Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America to Trinity. It is a history making Sunday here at Trinity when the Lutheran Bishop will join the laying on of hands for each confirmation prayer for the first time. Matthew & Katlyn Miller's family [on their father's side] attend Mt. Olive Lutheran Church. We welcome them to Trinity this morning to witness their confirmation. This is made possible by the Formula of Agreement passed by the ELCA and the UCC over 20 years ago. The Formula opened the doors for us to share our pastor with Zion Lutheran, Meyersdale these last two years.

Today is also an ending of a pastorate in the 245 year history of Trinity Church. Dr. David Williams after serving here since July 1, 2017 concludes his pastorate this morning as he has been called to serve as Senior Pastor of New Goshenhoppen Reformed United Church of Christ, East Greenville, PA beginning next Sunday. We welcome Rev'd Jay Shaffer this morning as he represents the Somerset Association and Penn West Conference to share in the Release of the Pastor.

Today we are privileged to welcome those who wish to confess their faith in Christ as Lord and Savior.

When they were baptized, God made clear his claim on them as his own, and they were received into the church.

Now they wish publicly to accept and confirm what was sealed in their baptism, confess their faith in the Lord Jesus, and offer themselves to God as his willing servants.

We thank God for having given them this desire and pray that as we now hear their confession, God's Spirit will strengthen all of us for continued service in Christ's kingdom.

Through baptism God gave us a gracious sign of love and hope in Christ.

Hear again the promises God has made to us in Christ.

Baptism is the sign and seal of God's promises to this covenant people.

In baptism God promises by grace alone to forgive our sins, to adopt us into the body of Christ, the church, to send the Holy Spirit daily to renew and cleanse us, and to resurrect us to eternal life.


