TUCC Congregational Meeting Minutes May 4, 2025

A congregational meeting was held Sunday, May 4, 2025, after worship. Pastor Dave Creamer offered prayer.

Bill Landis, Vice President presented slides containing the information on renting the parsonage with the following information.

Proposed lease would be per \$1000. per month, yearly renewal. This would include electric, water, gas, garbage and sewage, lawn care and snow removal. Our costs associated with lease would be liability insurance of \$500 per year, percentage of taxes on the parsonage \$550. per year, Leaser's utilities: electric, water, gas, garbage, sewage would be \$920. Total monthly cost incurred by Trinity UCC is \$165. Monthly profit \$835, \$10,020 per year.

Other attributes of Lease: Normal clauses about nonpayment, returned checks, etc. Security Deposit of 1 month rent, \$200 per pet. Limit of 2 dogs, Pet waste must be cleaned up every day. Household is limited to a family of 5, no business/work run out of house without written consent, includes use of garage on basement level, UCC carries fire insurance on building but not on contents of rented space, contains a long list of maintenance, repairs and rules including the number of guests visiting and duration, noise, use of deck (not storage), holes in walls, etc. Termination by ternate notification (30 days) and possible fees deducted from initial deposit. Termination by UCC in the event that we need the parsonage for a new pastor would be given a (60 days) notice to ternate and 1 month free rent. The consistory approval to move forward with renting the church parsonage based on present lease agreement and the consistory has approval to adjust lease rental amount based on current rental market, i.e., if unit doesn't rent then we may need to lower requested value.

The Lease agreement is available in the church office.

The following questions were asked:

Due to the congestion in the parking lot during church services and activities could the garage at the side of the

parsonage be offered instead of the garage in the parsonage? (This will be looked into).

Add a clause to the lease to include any illegal activity in parsonage would be immediate eviction. (This will be added to the lease agreement)

Is the church considered a business due to accepting rent? (this was answered, no it has no effect on the tax status of the church. It still is considered a non-profit).

Bill Landis presented the above for approval to rent the parsonage, seconded by Bob Brown. **Motion approved** by the congregation with several negative votes.

A motion was made by Julie Petro, seconded by Chris King to adjourn the congregational meeting. **Motion approved.**

Minutes for April meeting

Minutes for the April 14, 2025, meeting was sent to the consistory members electronically before the May meeting . A motion was

made by Jeanne Hillegas, seconded by Jean Hart to approve the April 14th minutes. Motion approved.

Treasurer's Report

The treasurer's report was given to the consistory prior to the meeting for review. No corrections were made. A motion was made by Lori Gindlesperger, seconded by Allison Zimmerman to accept the treasurer's report and file for audit. Motion approved. Jim Darr made a motion to take \$1000 from the General Fund and transfer to the Cemetery fund, seconded by Bill Landis. Motion approved.

Student Minister's report

Pastor Dave reported that a memorial service for Adeline Vieregge will be on Saturday, May 24th at 10:00am. He is coordinating the service with Kathy Spangler and Pastor David Williams. They requested that the service would be able to be broadcast. Tom Croner and Pam Bush volunteered to be on the Sound System for the service. A baptism for Paxton Peck will be on Sunday, June 8th. The baccalaureate service will be on Thursday, May 29th. He had 3 in-house visits, and one nursing home visit within the last month. The confirmation class has had two meetings, and the confirmands will start to Acolvte in Julv. The Church is in need of one adult delegate and one Youth delegate for the Penn West Conference meeting in June to approve the constitution. Pastor Dave has two individuals that will come for a meeting of those who are interested in starting a Care Committee in our church on Wednesday, May 28th. Pastor Dave is coordinating with the Lutheran Church Pastor on Heritage Sunday in October.

The group passed out cards, flowers, picture of the group and candy to the women of the church on Mother's Day and will be doing for the men on June 15th Father's Day. Trinity UCC is A2A certified!

In November of 2023 we began the process of making our congregation "Accessible to All" or A2A. In order to obtain this designation, we assigned a committee and met with the property committee and completed the A2A audit regarding specific questions about our church and then completed the application checklist which showed us where our church scored as we currently were as well as showed us areas that we needed to make improvements. Our base score was the minimum to pass at the beginning, but we knew that we could make improvements to make our church more accessible to all as this designation does not just mean having an elevator (although that is a very nice asset for our church to have). It meant making sure that our elevator had the correct braille signage, that we updated the faucets to be levers which are easier for people to use than knob type faucets and also put a pull-down sprayer in the kitchen area. It means that we have handicap accessible

restrooms with the proper height sink and towel dispensers. That our staircases have stable handrails and that our handicap parking area is marked well with new signage and new slipresistant black top which is well maintained in the winter as well as our heated sidewalk area to help reduce the ice build-up from our Somerset County winters! It meant making sure our ushers are educated on providing large print bulletins and hearing amplifiers to those who need assistive devices. How to help those in wheelchairs and with walkers to be seated in the handicap accessible areas of the church. It means live streaming our services for those who are homebound and also to make DVD's for those who request to watch the services in that manner. It means education for all of the congregation by the way of the bulletin in the availability of these services and newsletter articles about what A2A is and about ADA and Churches, vision and hearing impairment information and local resources and I plan on continuing the newsletter articles not only regarding physical disabilities, but also mental health awareness which everyone can benefit from. Our new student pastor Dave has also completed a training called ministering to persons with disabilities. After re-submitting our checklist with the improvements and continual ongoing education and awareness that we will strive to do, our congregation was approved for A2A certification by a vote of the UCC Disabilities Ministries Board. This will now list Trinity UCC of Berlin on the list of A2A churches at uccdm.org. If you have any other suggestions or educational opportunities that you would like to see addressed, please feel free to contact Amanda Custer or a member of the consistory. We are so excited for this meaningful acknowledgement for our church.
