#### Psalm 16

1 Preserve me, O God, for in thee I take refuge. 2 I say to the Lord, "Thou art my Lord; I have no good apart from thee." 3 As for the saints in the land, they are the noble. in whom is all my delight. 4 Those who choose another god multiply their sorrows: their libations of blood I will not pour out or take their names upon my lips. 5 The Lord is my chosen portion and my cup; thou holdest my lot. 6 The lines have fallen for me in pleasant places; yea, I have a goodly heritage. 7 I bless the Lord who gives me counsel; in the night also my heart instructs me. 8 I keep the Lord always before me: because he is at my right hand, I shall not be moved. 9Therefore my heart is glad, and my soul rejoices; my body also dwells secure. 10 For thou dost not give me up to Sheol. or let thy godly one see the Pit. 11Thou dost show me the path of life; in thy presence there is fulness of joy. in thy right hand are pleasures for evermore.

## Epistle – Romans 8: 18-30

- **18** I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us.
- **19** For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the sons of God;
- **20** for the creation was subjected to futility, not of its own will but by the will of him who subjected it in hope;
- 21 because the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to decay and obtain the glorious liberty of the children of God.
- **22** We know that the whole creation has been groaning in travail together until now;

- and not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we wait for adoption as sons, the redemption of our bodies.
- For in this hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what he sees?
- But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience.
- Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with sighs too deep for words.
- **27** And he who searches the hearts of men knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God.
- **28** We know that in everything God works for good with those who love him, who are called according to his purpose.
- **29** For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, in order that he might be the first-born among many brethren.
- And those whom he predestined he also called; and those whom he called he also justified; and those whom he justified he also glorified.

# **Gospel - Matthew 14: 13-21**

- 13 Now when Jesus heard this, he withdrew from there in a boat to a lonely place apart. But when the crowds heard it, they followed him on foot from the towns.
- As he went ashore he saw a great throng; and he had compassion on them, and healed their sick.
- When it was evening, the disciples came to him and said, "This is a lonely place, and the day is now over; send the crowds away to go into the villages and buy food for themselves."
- Jesus said, "They need not go away; you give them something to eat."
- They said to him, "We have only five loaves here and two fish."
- **18** And he said, "Bring them here to me."
- Then he ordered the crowds to sit down on the grass; and taking the five loaves and the two fish he looked up to heaven,

and blessed, and broke and gave the loaves to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the crowds.

**20** And they all ate and were satisfied. And they took up twelve baskets full of the broken pieces left over.

**21** And those who ate were about five thousand men, besides women and children.
