14 All these with one accord devoted themselves to prayer, together with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and with his brothers.

Epistle

1 Peter 4: 12-14, 5: 6-11

12 Beloved do not be surprised at the fiery ordeal which comes upon you to prove you, as though something strange were happening to you.

13 But rejoice in so far as you share Christ's sufferings, that you may also rejoice and be glad when his glory is revealed.

14 If you are reproached for the name of Christ, you are blessed, because the spirit of glory and of God rests upon you.

3 And this is eternal life, that they know thee the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom thou hast sent.

4 I glorified thee on earth, having accomplished the work which thou gavest me to do;

5 and now, Father, glorify thou me in thy own presence with the glory which I had with thee before the world was made.

Ascension Day occurred on Thursday, May 18th. The observance of the Solemnity of the Ascension is moved to the following **Sunday**, superseding the 7th Sunday of Easter. In case you don't have your bible handy, here is a review of those events.

The Ascension of Jesus is described in the first chapter of Acts in the Bible. It is the ascent of Christ from Earth to the Heavenly realm, which takes place 40 days after the resurrection in the presence of his disciples. As he ascends, a cloud obscures him from their view, and two men in white arrive to tell them that he will return "in the same way you have seen him go into heaven". In Christian doctrine, the ascension is correlated with the deification of Jesus, meaning that through his ascension, Jesus took his seat at the right hand of God.

1 In the first book, O The-ophilus, I have dealt with all that Jesus began to do and teach,

2 until the day when he was taken up, after he had given commandment through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen.

3 To them he presented himself alive after his passion by many proofs, appearing to them during forty days, and speaking of the kingdom of God.

4 And while staying with them he charged them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the promise of the Father, which, he said, "you heard from me,

5 for John baptized with water, but before many days you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit."

6 So when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, will you at this time restore the kingdom to Israel?"

7 He said to them, "It is not for you to know times or seasons which the Father has fixed by his own authority.

8 But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria and to the end of the earth."

9 And when he had said this, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight.

10 And while they were gazing into heaven as he went, behold, two men stood by them in white robes,

11 and said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into heaven? This Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven."

12 Then they returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is near Jerusalem, a sabbath day's journey away;

13 and when they had entered, they went up to the upper room, where they were staying, Peter and John and James and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James the son of Alphaeus and Simon the Zealot and Judas the son of James.

14 All these with one accord devoted themselves to prayer, together with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and with his brothers.

15 In those days Peter stood up among the brethren (the company of persons was in all about a hundred and twenty), and said,

16 "Brethren, the scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit spoke beforehand by the mouth of David, concerning Judas who was guide to those who arrested Jesus.

17 For he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry.

18 (Now this man bought a field with the reward of his wickedness; and falling headlong he burst open in the middle and all his bowels gushed out.

19 And it became known to all the inhabitants of Jerusalem, so that the field was called in their language Akeldama, that is, Field of Blood.)

20 For it is written in the book of Psalms,

'Let his habitation become desolate,

and let there be no one to live in it';

and

'His office let another take.'

So one of the men who have accompanied us during all the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us,

beginning from the baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from us—one of these men must become with us a witness to his resurrection."

And they put forward two, Joseph called Barsabbas, who was surnamed Justus, and Matthias.

And they prayed and said, "Lord, who knowest the hearts of all men, show which one of these two thou hast chosen

to take the place in this ministry and apostleship from which Judas turned aside, to go to his own place."

And they cast lots for them, and the lot fell on Matthias; and he was enrolled with the eleven apostles.

Lord, Thank You for the New Week and I ask that You Bless and Keep my Family and Friends in Jesus name ~ Amen
