For out of Zion shall go forth the law, and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem.

4 He shall judge between the nations,

and shall decide for many peoples; and they shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more.

The Epistle Lesson From Paul's Letter to the Romans Chapter 13, vs 11-14.

- **11** Besides this you know what hour it is, how it is full time now for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed;
- **12** the night is far gone, the day is at hand. Let us then cast off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light;
- **13** let us conduct ourselves becomingly as in the day, not in reveling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and not in quarreling and jealousy.
- **14** But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.

The Gospel of Jesus Christ From the Book of Mattew Chapter 3, vs 1-12.

- **1** In those days came John the Baptist, preaching in the wilderness of Judea,
- 2 "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."
- **3** For this is he who was spoken of by the prophet Isaiah when he said,
- "The voice of one crying in the wilderness:

Prepare the way of the Lord,

make his paths straight."

- **4** Now John wore a garment of camel's hair, and a leather girdle around his waist; and his food was locusts and wild honey.
- **5** Then went out to him Jerusalem and all Judea and all the region about the Jordan,
- **6** and they were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins.

- **7** But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming for baptism, he said to them, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come?
- 8 Bear fruit that befits repentance,
- **9** and do not presume to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father'; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham.
- **10** Even now the axe is laid to the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire.
- **11** "I baptize you with water for repentance, but he who is coming after me is mightier than I, whose sandals I am not worthy to carry; he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire.
- **12** His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing floor and gather his wheat into the granary, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."
