The Hebrew Scripture Lesson is From Isaiah Chapter 63, vs 7-9

7 I will recount the steadfast love of the Lord, the praises of the Lord, according to all that the Lord has granted us, and the great goodness to the house of Israel which he has granted them according to his mercy, according to the abundance of his steadfast love.

8 For he said, Surely they are my people, sons who will not deal falsely; and he became their Savior.

9 In all their affliction he was afflicted, and the angel of his presence saved them; in his love and in his pity he redeemed them; he lifted them up and carried them all the days of old.

The Epistle Lesson for today is from Paul's letter to the Romans Chapter 1, vs 1-7

- 1 Paul, a servant of Jesus Christ, called to be an apostle, set apart for the gospel of God
- **2** which he promised beforehand through his prophets in the holy scriptures,
- **3** the gospel concerning his Son, who was descended from David according to the flesh
- **4** and designated Son of God in power according to the Spirit of holiness by his resurrection from the dead, Jesus Christ our Lord,

5 through whom we have received grace and apostleship to bring about the obedience of faith for the sake of his name among all the nations,

6 including yourselves who are called to belong to Jesus Christ;
7 To all God's beloved in Rome, who are called to be saints:
Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ

The Gospel Reading is from Mattew Chapter 1, vs 18-25

18 Now the birth of Jesus Christ took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with child of the Holy Spirit;

19 and her husband Joseph, being a just man and unwilling to put her to shame, resolved to divorce her quietly.

- **20** But as he considered this, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary your wife, for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit;
- **21** she will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins."
- **22** All this took place to fulfil what the Lord had spoken by the prophet:
- 23 "Behold, a virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and his name shall be called Emmanu-el" (which means, God with us).
- **24** When Joseph woke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him; he took his wife,
- **25** but knew her not until she had borne a son; and he called his name Jesus.


